From the President

Can you believe it is already October? Before you know it, we'll be setting our clocks back and ending Daylight Saving Time (at 2 a.m. the first Sunday of November).

Personally, I look forward to the end of Daylight Saving Time (DST) as it makes it feel a little more like the holiday season is approaching since Florida is obviously not like other parts of the country where specific weather changes help people get into the holiday spirit. In my perfect world, once the holidays were over, I would change it so that we went right back to DST, but the government doesn't really ask me for my input.

Do you know why we have DST, let alone why the government changed the length of it? This will be our second year of extended Daylight Saving Time. It began last year as a result of the Energy Policy Act in 2005. The Act extended DST by four weeks from the second Sunday in March to the first Sunday in November. One of the biggest reasons we change our clocks for DST is that it reportedly saves electricity. The theory is that the demand for electricity in our homes is directly related to when we go to sleep and when we wake up. A large amount of electricity is consumed by lighting and appliance usage in the evenings when people are at home. By reducing the amount of time be-

tween sunset and bedtime, the requirement for electricity is reduced. The reason for this is that people tend to take advantage of the "longer" days that DST provides and are not at home as early in the evening as when it is not DST. Even though it is darker in the mornings during DST, the amount of energy saved in the evening outweighs the extra amount used in the morning. Studies in the 1970's indicated that we could trim the entire country's usage by about 1% each day by observing DST. The first studies on electrical savings since that time are being conducted now and it is expected that results will be out in another year or so.

Please enjoy this month's newsletter. We have an extremely exciting program this month (see Drew Elsberry's article on page 2). In addition to our regular program we will be honoring some very special members who have been ASHRAE members for a very long time (see Jennifer Isenbeck's article on page 4) and we will also be recognizing all of the Research Promotion donors from last year.

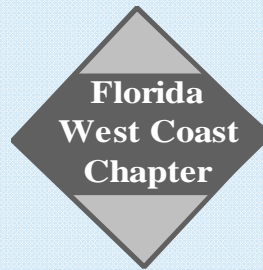
